

Historic Cities of Poland (7 days)



Day 1: Gdansk

Arrival to the old Hansa Town with colorful history. The town, which is also known as the town of memory and freedom, holds many intriguing sights. Guided city tour, during which you will see the historical heart of the city, follow the Royal Route through the historical streets, see the Basilica of Blessed Virgin Mary and the "Long Embankment" along the Gdansk Bay. Free time for lunch and individual activities in town in the afternoon. Dinner and overnight in hotel.

Day 2: Gdansk – Malbork - Warsaw

After breakfast at the hotel departure for Warsaw, the capital of Poland. Shortly after leaving Gdansk behind we will stop to visit the impressive UNESCO listed castle of Malbork. Guided tour of the castle. Journey continues south with free time for lunch on the way. Arrival to Warsaw in late afternoon. Dinner and overnight.

Day 3: Warsaw

After breakfast a guided tour around the city. Warsaw known as the "Phoenix city", has survived many wars throughout its history. The Historic Centre of Warsaw has been listed and UNESCO World Heritage Site and the city offers a lot of sight to see, including the Royal Palace. Free time for lunch. Afternoon free for individual sightseeing and activities. Dinner and overnight in hotel.

Day 4: Warsaw - Crakow

The journey continues further south to Crakow after breakfast at the hotel. Crakow is the second largest and one of the oldest cities in Poland. It was the Royal Capital of Poland from 1038 to 1795 and is a centre for academic, cultural and artistic life in the country. Free time for lunch on the way. Arrival to Crakow in the afternoon. Free time before dinner and overnight in hotel.

Day 5: Crakow

Breakfast is enjoyed at the hotel after which we depart for a guided tour of this magnificent city. The Historic Centre of Crakow, like in Warsaw, is listed as UNESCO World Heritage. In the 13th century Crakow was a merchants town and still has Europe's largest market square, numerous historical houses, palaces and churches. The main attractions include the remnants of 14th century fortifications, the Great Barbican, the Royal Palace and the Wawel Cathedral, with over 1000 years of history. That is where the Polish monarchs were coronated and where the kings of Poland were buried. Free time for lunch in the town during the tour. Dinner and overnight in hotel.

Day 6: Crakow – Wieliczka Salt Mines - Crakow

After breakfast in the hotel visit to the amazing Wieliczka Salt Mines (UNESCO), a whole subterranean world of more than 200 km of labyrinth passages, over 2000 caverns, lakes, chapels and sculptures carved in the salt rock in the period extending almost a millennium. Afternoon free in the city for lunch, individual sightseeing and souvenir shopping. Dinner and overnight in hotel.

Day 7: Crakow

After breakfast departure home.
